DECLARATION OF Joyce C. White

I, Joyce White, PhD, declare as follows:

- As an archaeologist who has studied the archaeology of Thailand at the University of Pennsylvania (Penn) since 1974 and the site of Ban Chiang since 1976, I have specialized knowledge about the prehistoric archaeology, especially the artifacts from prehistoric cultures, of Thailand and Southeast Asia. I was guest curator for the Smithsonian-produced exhibition "Ban Chiang, Discovery of a Lost Bronze Age" that circulated nationally and internationally from 1982-1987, and I wrote the text and the catalog for the exhibition. I was awarded my PhD in 1986, and my PhD Thesis was a revision of the chronology of Ban Chiang. I have been the director of the Ban Chiang Project based at the University of Pennsylvania Museum ever since, focusing on publication of the Penn excavations undertaken in the 1970s. I am currently close to finishing (with collaborators) a monograph on the evidence for prehistoric metallurgy of Ban Chiang. In 2013 I founded and become the Executive Director of a new nonprofit entity, the Institute for Southeast Asian Archaeology, dedicated to advancing the research of this region. We recently posted a new website on the Ban Chiang Project http://iseaarchaeology.org/the-ban-chiang-project/. I have knowledge of the facts set forth herein and could and would testify to those facts fully and truthfully if called and sworn as a witness.
- 2. Beginning in August 2005, I have authenticated more than 10,000 artifacts falling within the Operation Antiquity investigation that, based on my professional knowledge, must have been removed from prehistoric archaeological sites in mainland Southeast Asia,

primarily Thailand. The two Jonathan and Carolyn Markell cases before this court are part of Operation Antiquity.

- Based on my long familiarity with Thailand, it long has been common knowledge, stated in most tour guides, that individuals seeking to export antiquities must have a permit from the Thai Fine Arts Department (FAD).
- b. Among the thousands of artifacts I authenticated for Operation Antiquity, I saw only one or two examples where export permission had been obtained from the Thai Fine Arts Department.
- This led me to believe that the remainder had been looted (excavated illegally and without professional scientific methods) from prehistoric archaeological sites primarily in Thailand and then illegally imported into the United States.
- 3. The scale of the archaeological damage was obviously devastating for Thai archaeological resources.
- Artifacts entering the antiquities market such as those I authenticated for Operation Antiquity tend to be fairly intact. Intact artifacts are rare in archaeological sites and tend to come from human burials.
- To retrieve intact artifacts from sites like Ban b. Chiang, large scale excavations must be undertaken. Most of the materials recovered from such sites like Ban Chiang, which are occupation/mortuary sites, are overwhelmingly fragmentary artifacts and/or materials that are not marketable, such as human bones, animal bones, evidence of food, and other materials discarded during daily life such as broken pottery.
- Based on quantitative comparisons of materials c. recovered by scientific excavations at Ban Chiang and similar sites

with artifacts of similar condition that I authenticated for Operation Antiquity, I estimate that Operation Antiquity's artifacts represent somewhere between 10 to more than 175 times the scale of the Penn/FAD excavations at Ban Chiang in the mid 1970s. The lower number represents the most charitable calculation, but the higher number represents what I, in my professional opinion, believe is the minimum true scale of damage in terms of disturbed archaeological deposits represented by Operation Antiquity seizures.

4. Like other illegally imported commodities (e.g., illegal drugs), "production" in the source country is driven by the market in the recipient country.

- a. Villagers have no motivation to loot if there is no income gained, they do not just do it for fun or incidentally and produce numbers of artifacts or the scale of damage represented by the quantities of intact artifacts recovered by Operation Antiquity.
- 5. The Operation Antiquity cases are special and unusual, in that, the investigation uncovered and documented some of the drivers in the US market that provided major stimulus for vast amounts of damage to archaeological sites in Thailand.
- a. I understand from speaking to Operation Antiquity investigators that several individuals, including the Markells, were key players in developing the US market in Ban Chiang and related Southeast Asian prehistoric artifacts that drove the looting activity in Thailand and the illegal export of those materials to the US.
- b. If Operation Antiquity is to have a deterrent effect on the antiquities market and distributers, the individuals involved in pushing the market must be held accountable to the full legal extent.

- c. Only with clear and significant consequences for the marketers will, at least in the United States, other marketers of similar items be likely to change their behavior and choices to stop trafficking in antiquities.
- d. The absence of significant penalty will serve to encourage antiquities marketing and thus the continued looting, and really, the grave robbing, of archaeological sites around the globe.
- 6. The losses are much more than just for abstract knowledge of interest to a handful of academics.
- a. The evidence for 99.9% of human existence on the earth is held in archaeological deposits. Written historical testimony of the human past only exists for a few thousand years (and in Southeast Asia no more than 1500 years). Therefore destruction of archaeological sites is like destroying libraries of rare and unique ancient manuscripts that could tell us about our species development over tens and even hundreds of thousands of years and around the globe.
- b. Thailand's human heritage in particular is reliant on archaeological evidence because writing began in the territory only about 1500 years ago. Relative to parts of the world like Greece or the Near East, modern scientific archaeology has only recently been undertaken in Thailand, and experts, both Thai and international, are very few and poorly funded relative to areas with long histories of archaeological investigation. Therefore the scale of destruction represented by the Operation Antiquity case has had a proportionally greater impact on the heritage resources, because relatively little is known of the region's human prehistory.

- c. Heritage resources, when properly developed, can profoundly affect and help rural economies at the grass roots level. The Ban Chiang excavations and museum are a stellar example of how world-class excavations associated with professional museological presentation transformed a formerly sleepy village into a significant tourist destination—e.g., it has received TripAdvisor's "Certificate of Excellence"—— that brought significant resources into the pockets of ordinary villagers. In Thailand, there is increasing appreciation that in contrast to looting, heritage resource development represents a sustainable economic investment where the benefits can be distributed widely within a local community (not only employment with the heritage facility, but growth in associated sectors like restaurants and retail).
- 7. "Everyone was/is doing it" is no excuse. "Everyone" depends on the company kept (e.g., "Everyone is selling/taking drugs in South Central LA" or "Everyone on Wall Street is buying and selling stocks based on insider information" does not excuse the perpetrators or excuse the Justice Department from at least trying to enforce the law in the interests of the greater public good, especially when there is a good legal case.
- 8. Similarly "The Thais don't care" is no excuse. Some Thais may not care, but over the decades in which I have worked in Thailand, with the increasing educational level, increasing size of the middle class, the increasing sophistication accompanying the globalized access to knowledge, has come increased appreciation and valuation for their authentic heritage.

- a. A glance at the comments in Thai on TripAdvisor for Ban Chiang show a clear fascination of Thai visitors for discovering and learning about past societies that inhabited the Thai landscape.
- 9. By holding US-based antiquities marketers fully accountable for their role in promoting the antiquities market and thereby stimulating the global destruction of irreplaceable heritage resources, this court has a special opportunity to dampen that trade and encourage others conducting similar enterprises to change their behavior and choices. The court also has a special opportunity to raise the awareness of the general public about this massive problem so that laypersons also make choices not to purchase antiquities either in the United States or when visiting other countries.
- a. Twenty years ago the National Geographic Society published, "If the present rate of archaeological destruction continues, there may be no more sites to preserve in much of the world in 50 to 100 years. Because archaeological sites form an irreplaceable resource, we who are alive today are responsible for saving this valuable record, and archaeologists must sound the warning. If we do not meet this obligation, the incomplete knowledge gained up to now and in the very near future must suffice for the rest of time." From Archaeology and You. By George E.
